Policy for Sports Premium

Our school aim is for all children to be successful learners and we intend to eliminate all barriers to learning. In order to do this, we ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all the pupils.

The Sports Premium is used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of physical education (PE), physical activity and sport we offer.

This should be achieved by developing the PE, physical activity and sport activities that our school already offers and by building capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

Objectives

- Maintain a high profile for physical activity in all aspects of school life.
- Provide appropriate training for all staff, including teaching and non teaching staff, when required.
- To provide opportunities for pupils to participate in physical activity during play times.
- To encourage and support pupils to have access to a minimum of 2 hours curriculum time of high quality PE and sport each week, along with further opportunities to take part in out of school clubs.
- To monitor all pupils to ensure they are accessing physical activity beyond the PE curriculum.
- To provide opportunity for pupils to participate in a range of high quality sporting activities during lunchtimes and after school that are inclusive to all pupils.
- Provide links to other aspects of health, for example, by promoting healthy eating and provide access to water.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Active Surrey membership which includes membership to the association for PE and the youth sports trust. ○ Playground markings to enhance teaching in the outside classroom as well as enabling the children to play independently during lunchtimes. ○ Continual monitoring and supporting of high quality teaching, by PE leader ○ Continuous monitoring, replenishment and updating of quality sports equipment to support learning. ○ A new Sound system to enable teachers to teach dance and use music both inside and outside. ○ Teacher training courses and network meetings have been attended in order to keep teacher's knowledge of current practices and policies up to date. ○ Increase opportunities for disadvantaged children and less active children to be physically active, through the SWAN schools collaborative skills events. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Teaching staff have been kept up to date with any changes as part of ongoing professional development. ○ New playground markings have been seen to encourage children to create their own games and races during lunch time sessions and encourage children to be more creative with what they do in different areas. ○ Staff audits have provided information on where teachers feel their strengths and weaknesses are and these areas have been targeted. ○ Team teaching has shown that teachers are developing in confidence and are able to deliver high quality PE lessons to the children. ○ Children have been given opportunities to work collaboratively with local schools in the SWAN trust as well as other schools in competitions such as the Surrey multi skills competition and the panathlon. This has encouraged healthy competition as well as collaboration.
