VE Day 2025


This year marks the 80th anniversary of VE Day.

As you know over the last few years as a school we have invested in developing our bank of reading books, ensuring that the children have access to a wide range of texts to develop their reading.

Sadly we have noticed that some books are getting water damage from water bottles in bags.

To avoid any further damage to our books please could we ask that either water bottles are kept separate from the books or please can we ask that you put the books in a waterproof bag or wallet- e.g.: plastic zip wallet or food bag.

Summer Term curriculum supplies donation request

Once again, thank you to all of you who donated last term it is greatly appreciated and makes a big difference.

As previously outlined; to try and supplement the curriculum supplies fund, we are asking parents to donate a suggested contribution of £10 per term. This covers day to day items and supports enrichment activities such as cooking.

If you have not previously done so, please can we ask you to complete the Gift Aid form on ScoPay as this donation is eligible. You will need to log in through the browser www.scopay.com then select Your Info, then click on Gift Aid on the left-hand side (it is not possible to fill the form in through the app). Gift Aid is reclaimed by the charity from the tax you pay for the current tax year. So, if you are a UK taxpayer you are able to boost your donation by 25p of Gift Aid for every £1 you donate.

Please note you only have to complete the Gift Aid form once. We still have around 65 parents who have not completed the Gift Aid form which means we are missing out on around £160 of extra income per term.

Best wishes Mrs Reeve What's happening in Reception...

We have started our new topic "The Great Minibeast Adventure" and the children have loved describing Superworm and the Wizard Lizard. We are then moving on to find out facts about worms using the text "Yucky Worms" before continuing to explore other minibeasts through stories.

We will use the sounds we have learnt in phonics to write facts about different minibeasts and write sentences about the characters in our stories. We will be Persevering Parrots by using finger spaces between words. Our phonics lessons will revise sounds we have learnt in order to build fluency when we read as well as building our bank of words we can read on sight.

In Maths we will be counting to 20 and beyond to develop our accuracy as well as subitising some double patterns. We will continue our learning about the composition of numbers to 10 and compare two sets of objects.

In our Understanding the World learning, we will find out about David Attenborough and why he is important. We will continue to explore the natural world around us, making sure that we return any minibeasts we find back to their habitat.

The focus of our PE sessions will be gymnastics - please can children wear PE shorts on their PE days (underneath their joggers if needed). We will also use our gross motor skills during our outside learning and our small motor skills paying specific attention to our pencil grip and letter formation.





Phonics

The children will be working through Phases 3-4 in their Phonics groups.

Please spend time reflecting on the sounds in your child's Phonics reading book they take home on Tuesdays and Fridays.

To help with fluency, please help your child learn these tricky words:

my, by, you, was, they, said, are so, do, some, come, little, have, when, what

We appreciate your support in helping us to guide your child's reading development.

Please continue reading (and writing in the diary) with your child as this helps continue their progress and development. Thank you!

What's happening in Year 1...

Welcome to the Summer Term! This half term we are launching our 'Knights and Castles' topic. Our first text, 'The Castle the King Built', will introduce us to all of the jobs people working within the castle have, and we will use this information to carry out our non-fiction writing. We will also be reading 'The Paper Bag Princess' and using this to help us to structure short narratives.

The children will be taking part in a Knights and Castles workshop on the 14th May. This will be an exciting handson opportunity to explore our topic further and the children will participate in a range of activities such as dressing up in medieval costumes, taking part in a jousting tournament and learning about medieval etiquette.

In Maths this half term, we will be practising our 2, 5 and 10 x tables to help us with our multiplication and division. We will then be moving onto fractions, finding halves and quarters.

In Science, we will be revisiting materials and will find out how bricks and glass are made. In Art we will be exploring printing. We will be learning about different ways print is used, how prints are made, as well as creating our own print of a castle.

In PSHE this half term, we will be focusing on our relationships with others, including our friends and family. Our value this half term is cooperation, so we will be building this in to all of our learning.

Phonics

The children will be working through Phases 3-5 in their Phonics groups. Please spend time reflecting on the sounds in your child's Phonics reading book they take home on Tuesdays and Fridays.

Spelling

There is a list of High Frequency Words and Common Exception Words in the centre of the Reading Record for your child to practise at home. Your child needs to be able to spell these words by the end of the year.

What's happening in Year 2...

All aboard! We're off to see the bright lights of the big city! This term's topic is all about our exciting city of London and we will be exploring the capital, learning all about its' famous landmarks, key events in History including The Great Fire of London and sharing stories that have been inspired by London.

In Science, we will be revisiting our learning about materials and exploring the different types of materials that can be used to make bags. We will be testing to see which material is the strongest and most durable in wet weather. We will then use this knowledge to help us to design our own souvenir bag inspired by the artwork of printer, Paul Catherall who often uses the buildings in the city as starting points for his own art.

In English, we will be using the text, 'Katie in London' as inspiration for our writing. We will be creating our own stories including interesting sentences to 'hook' our reader, using adjectives and comparable suffixes to describe the famous landmarks.

In Maths, we will be learning about fractions. We will be learning how to recognise and find a half, a quarter, three quarters and to recognise a third.

On Friday the 9th May, we will be taking part in a Drama Workshop all about the Great Fire of London and have the Fire Service visiting us on 20th and 21st May to help us learn all about fire safety.
