Keeping children safe at school and how you can help

The safety of the children here at The Horsell Village School is paramount.

The journey to and from school can be one of the more hazardous parts of the day.

Here are a few things to remember and share that will help keep us all safe.



Last week at school the children took part in 'Road Safety' week. We learnt about the Green Cross Code and how to keep ourselves safe when crossing the road with our adults. Please continue to uses the designated crossing areas on the lead up to school, or be extra vigilant- we have recently had some near misses on the corner of Wilson Way.



Parking around school

Please continue to make use of the kindness of our local public houses- The Red Lion and The Crown- who enable us to park in their carparks during drop off and pick up. Just a gentle reminder not to leave your cars there all day. For school events such as our upcoming Nativity performances you will need to park else where or walk.

During the hours between 7.30 am and 5.00pm the staff carpark is for staff only. Amongst other things this for the safety of the children as in the dark nights it can be very difficult to see children in the carpark. Sadly some parents have been verbally abusive to staff members which is not acceptable.

If you are collecting from After School Club you can use the carpark after 5.00 pm only.




<u>Play Equipment</u>

Christmas Performances



The children are in the full swing of rehearsals and there is a real buzz of excitement in the air. With this in mind please see the information below to support in the smooth running of what I am sure will be a spectacular event.

- Please arrive back to school by 4.45 pm for the evening performances. Please bring your child to the front door dressed in their costumes. These will be sent home after the morning performances. If your child is not coming back for the evening performance please make sure you have informed your child's class teacher.
- For the evening performance the children will meet at the school and be brought over to the church by members of staff. This gives you time to find a seat in the church.
- At the end of the day and evening performances the children will be brought back over to school by members of staff. Please remain seated until we have all the children out of the church and across the road. A member of staff will indicate when it is suitable for you to leave. This enables us to get everyone back to school safely.
- Performances are expected to last about 30 minutes. If you are not at the evening performance please be back at school to pick up your child / children at 5.45 pm.
- Evening performances please pick your child up from the following areas: Year 2 - Front door

Year 1 & R - Library door.



Finally can I take this opportunity to remind you of the school's safeguarding measures and procedures around children performing. Keeping children safe is the golden thread that runs through everything we do here at The Horsell Village School. We therefore request that you do not take photographs or record / film any part of the school play.

I know, for some, this will come as a disappointment as it is a special time of year, however for many this can be a vulnerable time of year.

A simple picture or film uploaded to social media or shared can have significant repercussions for some. We are also upholding a large proportion of parent's wishes for their children not to be filmed- respectively so.

Please do not be offended should a member of staff speak to you during the performance if they feel this request is not being followed-they are simply doing their job and keeping everyone safe.

At school we will take an individual picture and send it home. But please, sit back and enjoy the children performing- they love to see your smiling faces.

ONLINE CONTENT 10 tips to keep your children safe online

The internet has transformed the ability to access content. Many apps that children use are dependent on user-generated content which can encourage freedom of expression, imagination and creativity. However, due to the sheer volume uploaded every day, it can be difficult for platforms to regulate and moderate everything, which means that disturbing or distressing images, videos or audio clips can slip through the net. That's why we've created this guide to provide parents and carers with some useful tips on keeping children safe online.



MONITOR VIEWING HABITS

Whilst most apps have moderation tools, inappropriate content can still slip through the net.



Make accounts private and set content filters and parental controls where possible.



ENCOURAGE CRITICAL THINKING

Talk about what people might post online and why some posts could cause distress.





Understand what's being shared or what seems to be 'trending' at the moment.



SPEND TIME ON THE APP

Get used to how apps work, what content is available and what your child likes to watch.



LEARN HOW TO REPORT & BLOCK

Always make sure that children know how to use the reporting tools on social media apps.



If a child has been affected by something they've seen online, seek support from your school's safeguarding lead.



Make sure they are old enough to use the app and meet the recommended age-limit.



LET CHILDREN KNOW YOU'RE THERE

Ensure they know that there is support and advice available to them if they need it.



If a child sees distressing material online; listen to their concerns, empathise and offer reassurance.

What's happening in Reception...

We have started our new topic "Dinosaur Celebrations" with great enthusiasm. So far, we have celebrated Guy Fawkes Night and Diwali. We have the celebrations of Hanukkah and Christmas to come.

We have also seen some active engagement in our dinosaur learning. We have compared dinosaurs to see what is the same and what is different. We have talked about the scientific words for meat eater (carnivore) and plant eater (herbivore). Children have been labelling parts of a dinosaur using their phonic knowledge (leg, head, back, neck) and some are even starting to write phrases, well done!

Recently, we have started getting ready for our Christmas play (see dates and times earlier on in the newsletter). The children have been learning the words to the songs, some actions to go with it. We are very proud of them and are sure you will be too when you come to see it!

In the next few weeks we will be discussing the Celebration of Christmas. Who celebrates Christmas and why? What traditions we have in our families for celebrating and if we do not celebrate Christmas, what we do on that day. Children will be able to then see the world through the eyes of others and to understand that celebrations can help us understand more about what different people believe.

We continue discussing and celebrating our differences in PSHE, thinking about how to be a kind friend by showing kindness to others.

Books are changed on a Tuesday and a Friday once parents/carers have commented in the diary. We appreciate your support in guiding your child's reading development.

Reminders

Please may we ask that you stay with your child in the morning before the classroom doors open and encourage them (and younger siblings) not to play with the equipment that is set up for the day's learning.

Have you logged on to Numbots to try a game? At the end of each half term children have the chance to earn a certificate for accuracy when playing.

What's happening in Year 1...

The children have thoroughly enjoyed our 'Fill up, Fuel up' topic this half term, particularly our visit to Boz's and tasting lots of new fruits when making their fruit salads. As we approach the final weeks of term, we continue to have lots of exciting learning to do, as well as some special events to look forward to!

In English we will be continuing to explore instruction writing. The children will be making and decorating Christmas biscuits in DT and using this to help them to write a set of instructions.

In Maths, we will be ordering and comparing numbers to 20 and will focus on 2-D shapes.

In Science we will be continuing to make observations of fruit and vegetables to see what happens to them over time, and drawing our final conclusions.

In PSHE, we will be continuing to explore emotions, with a focus on the feelings of excitement and disappointment, and we will reflect on times when we have felt like this and why.

Please continue to read as much as possible over the Christmas break. We are so proud of the progress the children have made during their first term in Year 1!


The children will be working through the Phases in their Phonics groups:

What's happening in Year 2...

The children over the next few weeks will be completing their learning connected to the topic, Bikes and Buses before moving on to learning all about Christmas.

In English, we will be writing our own versions of the Hundred Decker Bus and working hard to include everything we have become more expert on this term. We will be looking at different ways that we can start sentences in a narrative and will be using our knowledge of adjectives to describe settings and characters.

In Maths, we will be solving problems involving addition and subtraction, shape and symmetry. .

As Scientists, we will explore how to stay fit and healthy and in D.T and Art, we will be learning how to sew a Christmas tree decoration and shape and join clay to create a tea light holder.

Our P.S.H.E learning continues to be about celebrating differences, including what makes us special and how we can all be a good friend and show kindness to others.

We'd like to thank you for all your support this term, particularly those who helped on our trip and walks. We hope you all have a wonderful holiday! Please take time to read regularly throughout the holiday.
