

What's happening in Reception...

The children have been enjoying our topic "Are we there yet?" We finish this topic by looking at The Naughty Bus....I wonder what it gets up to?

After Half Term we start our new topic "Growing." We will look at vegetables growing and animals growing.

We are so impressed with the children's writing. This continues to be a focus, looking at how we form letters, using finger spaces between words and listening out for all the sounds in words.


In Maths we will continue our learning by comparing quantities and looking at the composition of 9 and 10.

We will be singing lots of different songs and learning some new poems. Some of these you may see in our class assemblies.

In our Understanding the World learning, we will find out who Garret Morgan is as well as revisit what was important about Amelia Earhart. We will revisit what we have learnt in our "Are we there yet Topic" so we can finish our Learning Cycle by talking about What we know now.

In PSHE, we will begin the new topic "Healthy Me" thinking about how our bodies need movement and rest to be healthy.

Phonics

We begin February with a phonics assessment. Then your child will either revise some of the taught sounds or look at the new sounds:

We will revise all our phase 2 and 3 sounds

We will look at the tricky words: we are like you

Reading:

Please can we ask for your child to read to you at home on a daily basis? We notice that once we start teaching digraphs (two letters that make one sound) reading can become trickier for some children. We know that regular practice helps the children retain these sounds so appreciate your support in helping the children reach their full potential in reading. Thank you!

What's happening in Year 1...

As we approach the end of our topic, Underwater Adventure, we will be reviewing our learning and reading our final text Tiddler by Julia Donaldson.

Our topic for after Half Term is 'Carnival of the Animals. The children will identify and name a variety of animals found at the zoo and will sort and classify them. We will revisit the continents in geography and will look at where in the world different animals live.

We are looking forward to visiting Marwell Zoo, which will be a lovely opportunity for the children to see the animals we have been learning about in the flesh.

We will learn about the life of Sir David Attenborough and the important work he has carried out educating the world about the wide variety of species that live on this delightful planet! In English, we will develop our letter writing skills and will be writing a letter to Sir David Attenborough about the animals we have learnt about.

In Maths, we will begin to explore measure, looking at length, mass and volume and exploring the vocabulary relating to each area.

What's happening in Year 2...

We have come to the end of our Magic Library topic with the brilliant book 'Journey' by Aaron Becker.

This amazing story has no words so we will be using all of our learning this term to create a story of our own inspired by the pictures.

In Science we will be reviewing everything we have been learning about animals and their offspring and discussing what we discovered through our 'eggsperiments'.

In Maths we have been exploring the concept of 'grouping' and introducing the multiplication symbol. We will complete this terms learning by using what we now know to help us solve a range of mathematical problems.

Next Half Term our topic will be 'The Living Rain forest'. We will be visiting Kew Gardens to learn about how different plants adapt to different climates and will be exploring the animals and plants that live in the Rain forest.

Much of our learning will be based around the stories 'The Rain Forest Grew all Around' and 'The Great Green Forest'. These will inspire us to write poetry and persuasive letters about the rain forest. We will create our own artwork inspired by the plants and creatures that thrive in a rain forest and will use maps to identify where rain forests are located around the world.
