## DREAMS AND GOALS

We will be exploring and learning about:

- Our aspirations and how to achieve them.
- How to set small goals and how to manage our expectations of them.
- How to challenge ourselves and the emotions that can come when we find things tricky.
- How to work together effectively and understand that everyone has different viewpoints, ideas and opinions and how we can share these to develop our own ideas.
- Our own resilience and developing an emotional toolkit to support.
- Simple budgeting.



In Reflections this half term we will be exploring the meaning of honesty and the feelings and emotions associated with being truthful and what could happen when we are not truthful.

We will be using a variety of different stories and tales as starting points for discussion.

At home, discuss with your child the importance of this value and perhaps share your own experiences of living this value out.

Curriculum News Focus on Oracy Here at The Horsell Village School our teaching and learning approach has Oracy at its heart. Supporting children to develop effective communication skills - whether this be verbal or non verbal, it's an essential life long skill. Oracy can:


- 1) Enhance social and emotional development by supporting children to express their needs and communicate effectively with both peers and adults.
- 2) Empower children to better understand themselves, each other and the world around them by specifically teaching effective speaking and listening skills
- 3) Develop strong communication skills, which are essential for success both academically and personally for mental health and well-being
- 4) Support the fostering of critical thinking by encouraging children to think critically about information and ideas and expose them to higher level vocabulary and context.
- 5) Build confidence in expressing themselves to different audiences and in different situations,

The Horsell Learning Cycle is used in every lesson and at the beginning and end of a unit of learning or part of a weekly review session.

Each lesson starts with the question 'What do I already know'- this provides opportunity for children to recall previous skills and knowledge and recall key vocabulary.

'What will help me learn' refers to the characteristics of an effective learner and 'What do I know now' provides opportunity for children to share what they have learnt and 'talk like an expert' using subject specific vocabulary

The Horsell Learning Tree is used in every lesson across KSI and clearly identifies the key knowledge and learning skills for a unit of work. Key vocabulary for each unit of work is clearly identified and shared through our Word Aware approach. Children are encouraged to use this higher level focused vocabulary when talking about and sharing their learning.



The 'Characteristics of effective learning animals' forms part of our Learning Cycle and are referred to in every lesson. Language to support our children to express how they are feeling is modelled throughout.



At School, we use Word Aware which is a structured whole school approach to promote the vocabulary development of all children. Our aim is to develop the children's spoken and written vocabulary.

Vocabulary development is critical for overall cognitive development, literacy skills, and language acquisition and is directly linked to school achievement.

## What can you do at home?

Are there any familiar words used in your home, for example 'tired', 'hungry' ? Try to introduce a synonym for that word for your child to practise using e.g. weary, famished. Exposing children to new vocabulary, used in context, will help their understanding and they will be more likely to use this vocabulary themselves.

## What's happening in Reception...

Welcome back! We hope you enjoyed a restful break. The children have returned to school with lots of stories about what they did over Christmas and are displaying excellent learning behaviours. Well done!

We have started our new topic "Are we there yet?" with great enthusiasm. So far, we have looked at aeroplanes. We have explored where Emma Jane might be going on her journey by looking at the cover of Emma Jane's Aeroplane. Next, we will read the story and use a map to find where she has been. All the Reception team are very proud of how motivated the children are at recording their ideas in words and sentences. We can see the phonics we have learnt being applied. We will continue learning diagraphs now, please practise these at home too.


In Maths we are continuing our learning on subitising, counting and composition of number. We will be representing quantities and matching these with numerals.

We will be singing lots of different songs and learning some new poems. Some of these you may see in our class assembly!

In our Understanding the World learning, we will consider special places and how it feels to belong to them. We will discuss places of worship and how they are special to people. Also, we will find out about Amelia Earhart and Garret Morgan and how transport has changed over time.

In PSHE, we are beginning our new topic "Dreams and Goals" thinking about how to stay motivated when doing something challenging and how we can set a goal and work towards it.

Our PE sessions will focus on balancing - static and dynamic. We will also use our gross motor skills during our outside learning and our small motor skills paying specific attention to our pencil grip.





## Phonics

Books are changed on a Tuesday and a Friday once parents/carers have commented in the diary. We appreciate your support in guiding your child's reading development.

## Reminders

Please may we ask that you stay with your child in the morning before the classroom doors open and encourage them (and younger siblings) not to play with the equipment that is set up for the day's learning.

# What's happening in Year 1...

We have started the year, diving straight into our new topic, 'Underwater Adventure'. We will be beginning with the text, 'The Storm Whale' and will explore fiction writing looking at character and setting description as well as the story's main events, thinking about what might happen next. We will then use the text 'Somebody' Swallowed Stanley' to inspire our non-fiction writing, exploring the issue of pollution. We will finish our topic with 'Tiddler' by Julia Donaldson. Our Geography learning will be around revisiting the five oceans and locating them on a map of the world.

In Maths, we will be focusing on addition, subtraction and place value within 20, including number bonds and doubles.

Our Art will be inspired by the work of Sue Coccia. We will be using our observational skills to zoom in on a variety of sea creatures and exploring line, tone and texture.

In Computing, we will be learning all about the importance of following a set of instructions as we learn all about what a computer algorithm is.

Our PE this half term is gymnastics and the children will be developing their use of balance and coordination.

In PSHE, we will be focusing on goals and dreams and how we can set a goal, work towards it and experience success.



## What's happening in Year 2...

Welcome back everyone!

On the very first day back in school we had a mysterious door appear in our classroom.
