RSE Curriculum



We previously shared with you our Relationships and Sex Education information. This provided you with detail around how we teach this part of the curriculum, which emphasized the link between RSE and the Science National Curriculum.

Here at The Horsell Village School we use the NSPCC 'Pants' rule to help children understand their body belongs to them and they should tell a safe adult they trust if anything makes them feel upset or worried.

This rule is shared with the children at multiple times throughout the year and posters are located throughout the school to support their understanding.

As we approach the part of the year where our PSHE curriculum has an increased focus on RSE-Relationships and Sex Education - a few more questions may arise at home. If this is the case, please don't worry~ it is perfectly normal.

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

What's happening in Reception...

We have started our new topic "World Explorers" and the children are looking forward to having Simon Airey visit us on Thursday 6th June to share different animals that live around the world. We will see a tarantula, snake, scorpion, chameleon and hopefully a chinchilla!

We have started this half term with Art and History week by looking at Beatrix Potter and have been inspired by her artwork, creating our own versions of Peter Rabbit. You will see these at our Celebration of Learning event.

This half term will see us travel around the world, beginning at home and then exploring Asia, Australia, Africa, South America and North America. We will use the sounds we have learnt when we write about the books we are reading and relating these to our own experiences. We will continue focusing on using finger spaces between words. Our phonic lessons will revise sounds we have learnt in order to build fluency when we read as well as building the bank of words we can read on sight.

In Maths we will be consolidating all our learning so far this year looking at the composition of numbers, counting up to and beyond 20, comparing numbers as well as looking at doubles and odds and evens.

In our Understanding the World learning, we will discuss what makes our world wonderful, find out about the different continents and countries as well as exploring animals from different countries and where they live. We will explore maps and discuss the differences between living in our country and other countries.

We have been getting ready for Sports Day and are looking forward to this on June 25th. We will continue practising all our events as well as focus on balancing in our indoor PE sessions.

Phonics

The children will be working through Phases 2-4 in their Phonics groups.
Please spend time reflecting on the sounds in your child's Phonics reading book they take home on Tuesdays and Fridays.

Tricky words:

Please use the tricky word cards handed out at Parents Evening to guide your child's learning. These are words that cannot be sounded out so will need to be read on sight.

We appreciate your support in guiding your child's reading development.

What's happening in Year 1...

We cannot believe it is the final half term. What a great year it has been! We have launched this half term with Arts and History Week and the children are thoroughly enjoying learning all about the life and works of Beatrix Potter.

Next week, we will begin our 'Secret Garden' topic. We have some lovely texts that we will be using to inspire our narrative writing. Using 'The Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle, we will be exploring the illustrations and where the tiny seed will go next. This links to our Science learning which will be all about what plants need to grow and the children will be working scientifically to investigate the best conditions for plant growth.

In geography, we will be studying the four countries in the UK and their capital cities. We will be learning about Lancelot 'Capability' Brown, a significant figure in history, who is remembered as a grand designer, entrepreneur and salesman and became the UK's most famous landscape designer of the 18th century. We will be creating Art inspired by nature and will look at the work of William Morris and Claude Monet.

In maths, the children will be focusing on measures which includes learning about coins and money and telling the time. At home, you could explore these maths topics practically with your child, for example keeping a diary of your day and what time you do things and recognising and counting up the coins in your purse/wallet.

Phonics

Our Phonics Screener will be taking place w/c 10th June. For the remainder of the year, the children will be recapping over Phases 3-5 in their Phonics groups. Please spend time reflecting on the sounds in the Phonics reading book your child brings home on Tuesdays and Fridays.

Spelling

There is a list of High Frequency Words and Common Exception Words in the centre of the Reading Record for your child to practise at home. Your child needs to be able to spell these words by the end of the year.

What's happening in Year 2...

Ahoy there me hearties! There be pirates in these here places! Shiver me timbers and avast ye - we are all off to pirate school to learn all about pirates, how to survive the seven seas, make everything look shipshape and prepare for sailing on to new adventures.

In English, we will be using non-fiction texts to help us learn about pirates in the past and find out about the ships they sailed and what life was like at sea. We will be using the texts The Pirate Cruncher, The Night Pirates and The Pirates are Coming to help us create pirate stories of our own.

In Maths, we will be revising directions and our 2D and 3D shape knowledge and practising solving two step number problems.

In Science, we will be looking at floating and sinking (very important for pirates to know!) and testing materials to see which work best for a raft - just in case we are shipwrecked. We will also be learning all about how to help ourselves stay happy and healthy whilst out at sea.

We will also be creating pirate portraits, learning sea shanties and bucket drumming so that we have entertainment whilst at sea.




