
On Thursday 7th November we will be exploring the celebration of Diwali.

Heading home with someone else?



#### What's happening in Reception...

The children thoroughly enjoyed our topic last half term "Anyone can be a Hero" – especially the visit by the fire engine and fire fighters who told us about how they help people and how we needed to 'stop, drop and roll!'

We have seen some fantastic Go for It Gorillas over the last month, well done everyone! We have discussed all the characteristics now. See if your child can remember when they were showing these behaviours. We are sure some Creative Chameleons will be in force this week with our firework activities.



The return to school sees our new topic starting "Dinosaur Celebrations". We begin this topic by discussing Bonfire night, why it is celebrated and how to be safe around fireworks. We then move on to some dinosaur topic related learning, reading 'The Worrysaurus' where we discuss emotions and 'Mad About Dinosaurs' where we will look at rhymes. In PSHE we are celebrating differences, thinking about how we are special and unique as well as how we are the same.

We are trying hard to write some CVC words with the sounds we have learnt e.g. cat, hop, sit. Have a go at writing some words at home too!

We have been focusing on counting accurately and using our super subitising skills (don't count, say the amount). Play a game with a dice at home and see if you can subitise the number!

Books will be changed on a Tuesday and a Friday once parents have commented in the diary. We appreciate your support in guiding your child's reading development.

#### Reminders

Please may we ask that you stay with your child in the morning before the classroom doors open and encourage them (and younger siblings) not to play with the equipment that is set up for the day's learning.

Please ensure all items of clothing are named.

#### What's happening in Year 1...

The children have been introduced to the new topic for this half term, 'Fill up, Fuel up.'

We have started by zooming in on fruits and exploring all the adjectives we can use to describe how they look, feel and taste. In Science we will be exploring fruits further and will investigate changes to foods over time.

In DT, we will be preparing a fruit salad and will make Christmas biscuits, focusing on safety and hygiene. The children will be learning to design, make and evaluate their own food products. During the preparation and making stages, we will be learning to cut, spread, peel etc.

We will be drawing upon our real life experiences in school to help us to write instructions in English. In our writing, we will be using imperative verbs (wash, cut, peel...) and time conjunctions (first, then, next...).

In Geography, we will be developing our map reading skills and will revisit the continents and oceans. In Art, we will study the work of the artists Caravaggio and Arcimboldo. We will be developing our drawing skills, focusing on line, tone and texture.

Our PSHE this half term is focusing on celebrating differences, including what makes us special and how we can all be a good friend and show kindness to others.



#### What's happening in Year 2...

Master Makers - Bikes and Buses

Happy November everyone!

We have an exciting month of learning ahead of us including a trip to Brooklands Museum on Monday 25th November.


We will be beginning our new topic 'Bikes and Buses'.

In Maths, we will be learning how to add and subtract a one digit number from a two digit number and a two digit number from another two digit number.

In English, we will be using the story, 'Pedal Power' to inspire us to create posters informing others about the benefits of riding more bikes.

We will then be using the story, 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels' as a starting point to help us with our learning about how to use different sentence starters, adjectives and adverbs. In Science, we will be learning about keeping healthy and healthy diets and using our knowledge to help cyclist Chris Hoy stay healthy whilst training and, in History, we will be learning about how bikes have changed over time. In Art, we will be learning how to mould and join clay and creating a decorative candle holder and in DT we will be designing and creating our own vehicles using wheels and axles.

We will also be honouring Remembrance Day, recognising the service of others and discussing how this reflects our school motto of kindness.
