Whole school priorities for 2024 to 2025

This year through responses from parent, staff and pupil surveys as well as end of year outcomes, development points identified by Ofsted and discussions with the Local Governors Committee, we have identified 3 key objectives. All objectives link to our 3 Year Strategic aims.

Parent Conferences

Parent conferences are coming up soon. Thank you to everyone who has already booked an appointment to see their child's class teacher.

Please do not worry if you haven't done this yet- you can still log on and book an appointment.

Attending your child's parent conference provides you with that 1:1 time with the class teacher to find out about how your child is doing in the development of their academic and personal and social development. We know life can by busy, so please if you need to book an alternative appointment with the class teacher let us know.

These meetings are important to us too and are crucial in working together to ensure the best for all our children.

For those unable to attend we will be following upplease don't be offended if we call or email your we only want to support everyone.



Back In July we wrote to the parents and carers of children in KS1 in regards to the new Dfe statutory guidance on working together to improve school attendance.

Our new attendance policy has been amended to reflect these current changes and will be available on our school website soon.

The policy applies to all children that attend The Horsell Village School, however criteria for possible fining will only apply to children of statutory school age. (Children over 5)



A few little reminders

- The school gates open at 8.35 am.
- The school doors open at 8.40 am and close at 8.50 am.
- Arrivals after 8.50 am will be marked as late. Please head round to the school office where you will be asked to sign your child in.
- School finishes at 3.20 pm. Late collection is monitored in the same way late morning drop offs are and may result in sanctions.
- Please report unplanned absences through the online form- which can be found on the school website www.horsell-village.surrey.sch..uk/parents/attendance
- Unplanned absences need to be reported by 9.00 am.
- Should no reason for absence be provided by 9.00 am the school will begin its first day calling protocols.
- Planned absences need to be requested for at least two weeks in advance by completing a leave of absence form. Planned absences will be considered by the Headteacher but will rarely be authorised.

Sanctions for unauthorised absences

Where any pupil we expect to attend school does not attend, or stops attending, without reason, the school will:

- Call the pupil's parent / carer on the morning of the first day of unexplained absence to ascertain the reason. If the school cannot reach any of the pupil's emergency contacts, the school will implement its first day calling protocols.
- Identify whether the absence is approved or not.
- Identify the correct attendance code to use and input it as soon as the reason for absence is ascertained – this will be no later than 5 working days after the session(s) for which the pupil was absent.
- Call the parent on each day that the absence continues without explanation, to make sure proper safeguarding action is taken where necessary. If absence continues, the school will consider involving an education welfare officer.
- Where appropriate, offer support to the pupil and/or their parents to improve attendance- this will include stage 1 letters- notice of improvement, stage 2 meetings and development of an attendance contract to improve attendance.
- Identify whether the pupil needs support from wider partners as quickly as possible.

Where support is not appropriate, not successful, or not engaged with, the school will consider issuing notification, a penalty notice or other legal intervention to Surrey County Council. The Headteacher may give notice to Surrey County Council to issue a fine (known as a fixed-penalty notice) for unauthorised absence. The decision whether to issue a fine will take into account whether the national threshold has been met – namely 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a rolling period of 10 school weeks – as well as other factors.

Before a fine is issued, you may receive a notice to improve to give you a chance to engage with support.

Let's work together to celebrate and encourage regular attendance.

Here at The Horsell Village School, we are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people. Safeguarding and keeping children safe is everybody's responsibility. In addition to this we have a named team of Designated Safeguarding Leads and Deputies who are the main point of contact,.

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Maths

Maths

Here at The Horsell Village School we use White Rose Maths to support our learning. If you would like to help your child at home, you can download a White Rose Maths One-Minute Maths App to help your child's number sense and use this alongside Numbots (see below). Together, these will build number fluency and confidence. At the beginning of each year, Year 1 and 2 focus on place value - the value of each digit based on its position.


Year 1 have been counting on from any number and working out one more and one less.

Year 2 have been recognising tens and ones in two digit numbers as well as looking at the intervals between numbers.

Reception have started their Maths routine by counting, matching and sorting objects.

Talking about Maths is really important for your child's mathematical development.

As simple as asking your child to count the number of fish fingers on their dinner plate. What if you have one more/one less? What if you have double or half of the number? What if we add your fish fingers to mine?

Reception children will get their log in details very soon!



We use a program called Numbots to help children develop a secure sense of number . You will find the log in details in your child's reading diary. We encourage them to use it little and often (eg. 3 minutes, 4/5 times a week).

At the end of each half term, certificates will be presented to those that have been accurate in their Numbots learning and those that have spent time engaging in this activity.

What's happening in Reception...

We continue to be proud of how the children have settled into school. Thank you for your continued support ensuring the children arrive on time.

We have been to our first Reflections (assembly) and the children showed how well they could join in our routines. We go every Friday for our Celebration Reflections.

We continue focusing on good listening skills and displaying our motto Kindness to yourself, Kindness to others and Kindness to the world. This week we are introducing two of our effective learner animals:

Slinky Linky Snake Proud Peacock





Talk to your children at home about ways they can make links in their learning alongside how and why people feel proud.

Our PE lessons start from Monday 7th. Initially we will be visiting the hall, playing some games and learning how to use the equipment safely. Please make sure your children come to school in PE kits.

On Friday last week, we visited the Church for our Harvest Festival. Reception proudly stood and performed the poem "Chop Chop". See if your child can say it for you (with actions!) at home.

Please may we ask that you stay with your child in the morning before the classroom doors open and encourage them not to play with the equipment that is set up for the day's learning.

Please help your children be independent in opening and closing their fruit pot and putting on and zipping up their coats.

What's happening in Year 1...

The children have thoroughly enjoyed the texts we have been reading for our 'Destination Outer' Space' topic and have produced some wonderful writing. We have been continuing to embed our key writing skills this half term and the children have made good progress, particularly with their use of adjectives and remembering to leave a finger space between each word. Next week, we will begin looking at our final text, 'The Way Back Home' and will explore the senses, thinking about what the boy in the story might see, hear and feel. We will also be writing creatively about how we think the boy will get back home.

In Maths, the children will be moving onto exploring number fact families and we will be using the part-part-whole model to help us to write addition

number sentences.



In History, we will be revisiting the three significant people we have been learning about: Neil Armstrong, Helen Sharman and Tim Peake and will plot key events on a timeline. In Science, we will be carrying out investigations looking at different materials and whether or not they are absorbent. A reminder that our VR Space workshop will be happening in school on Tuesday 15th October.



What's happening in Year 2...

Well done to all our Year Two children for how well they have settled back into school life and routines. We are very proud of how well they are developing their skills as role models for the younger learners in school.

October is the month of 'Master Makers' and we will be finding out about sculptures in our local environment; mapping where they are and comparing and contrasting what we can see in our locality with other areas.

In Science and D.T, We will be investigating different materials, including paper and developing our paper skills so that we can create paper sculptures of our own inspired by the story, 'The Tin Forest'.

In English we will be writing poems inspired by the story before moving on to our final story, Hephaestus. We will use the new story to help embed our knowledge and understanding or nouns, adjectives and verbs and will plan and write our own version of the story.

In Maths our learning will focus on addition and subtraction. We will practise and embed our number bond knowledge and investigate what happens when we add or subtract across a ten.

In Computing we will continue creating simple codes using command blocks and will be learning how to keep safe online in school and at home.
