Miss Richardson is our schools Mental Health Lead. Supporting children to develop an understanding of their own physical and mental health is something we have always been passionate about here at The Horsell Village School. From learning to identify and recognise different emotions to developing our own self regulation tool kits, through to learning about what positive healthy relationships look to providing support and advice for our parent community—we are here to help. Miss Richardson will be running drop in sessions relating to how we can support our children's mental health on the second Friday of every month from 1.00 pm to 3.00 pm in the Hive. Additional information explaining the focus for each session will be sent in the next few weeks.

Of course, please do not wait for these sessions to raise a concern. Working together is essential in ensure the best outcomes for our children.

Again please do not worry if you cannot physically attend these meetings as they will be shared via email and on our curriculum pages of the school website



Jewellery

We ask that no jewellery is worn at school, this includes earrings. If your child has recently had their ears pierced, during the 6 week healing time, we ask that you cover their earrings with tape every day. After 6 weeks, we expect the earrings to be removed for school.

Children in Year 2 may wear an analogue watch to support the Year 2 Maths curriculum of being to tell the analogue time.



Birthday Celebrations

We celebrate each child's birthday at school. We would like to remind you that we do not give out birthday sweets.

Hair - The long and short

We encourage children to be as active as possible, therefore we ask that hair is tied back every day. A good guide is if it is long enough to be tied back then it should be. We kindly remind parents that extreme hair fashions are not permitted. This includes styles such as shaved lines, patterns, or other designs Hair accessories should be as plain and simple as possible and in the school colours.

Keeping Healthy

We ask that your child brings to school a fresh fruit or vegetable snack each day. (no nuts) We provide your child with an additional snack in the afternoons. Whilst at school, it is also important for your children to keep hydrated. Please send them to school each day with a named water bottle.

Communications

I am sure you can appreciate that drop-off is a very busy time and class teachers have a lot to remember as well as settling the children into school. Should you need to pass an important message onto the class teachers in the morning, please email or ring the school office in the first instance and we will ensure that the message gets to them.

Drop off and pick up

To make drop off and pick up run smoothly, please can we request that you:

- Arrive between the allocated time.
 The school gates open at 8.35 am in the mornings and will close at 8.50 am. Learning starts as soon as they children are in.
- Please do not use your mobile phone on site, during drop off and pick up. We have a duty of care to safeguard all children.
- If you are running late (we know things happen) - please ring the school office to keep us informedthis helps us to prepare your child / children - especially at the end of a school day.
- If someone different is picking up, please inform the school office before 2.30 pm. Messages received after 3.00pm do not allow the office staff sufficient time to get to the classrooms.
- Please be considerate of our neighbours when parking.

Finally, could we ask that once you have dropped off or picked up your child that you do not congregate on the drive into the car park. It gets very busy during these times and this area can become especially congested for other members of the public.

What's happening in Reception...

A very warm welcome to the start of a new and exciting year in Early Years! We are absolutely delighted to have your little ones with us and look forward to getting to know each child as they begin their learning journey at 'big school'.

The first few weeks are all about settling in, building relationships, and creating a nurturing environment where every child feels safe, valued, and inspired to explore. We've already seen some wonderful moments of curiosity, kindness, and confidence emerging in our classrooms!

We've also been getting to know the different members of our class—sharing interesting facts about ourselves, talking about our likes and dislikes, and discovering what makes each of us unique. These early conversations are helping us build a strong sense of community and friendship.

As the children begin to stay for lunch and then full days, we're looking forward to introducing them to the wider school environment, including the playground and other shared spaces. This is an exciting step, and we'll be supporting them every step of the way.

Our first full day of school is Friday 12th September, and we're thrilled to be launching our first topic: 'Anyone Can Be a Hero'. During this topic, we'll be exploring the many different roles adults play in our school and community. We'll be talking about the jobs people do, what makes someone a hero, and even thinking about what we might like to be when we grow up!

We will encourage the children to think about themselves as learners. Here at school, we use the 'Characteristics of Effective Learning' zoo to help children understand how they learn best—whether it's through exploring, being creative, or keeping on trying. These characteristics will be woven into our daily activities and celebrated throughout the term.

We believe that strong partnerships with families are key to a successful start, so please don't hesitate to reach out.



Phonics

Here at The Horsell Village School we use 'Bug Club' to teach our phonics program. Each lesson is split into 4 sections, - identifying sounds, blending, reading and writing.

We will be starting our phonics lessons soon and then sending out reading bookswhen we have learnt the first set of sounds.

What's happening in Year 1...

A warm welcome to everyone who has joined Year I, this year. The children have had a wonderful start to the term and have settled into the new routines of KSI. This week, we are launching our new topic, 'Destination Outer Space'. The children will be introduced to a new text and will be practising writing simple sentences about the character and story, exploring different adjectives to use in their sentences. This half term, we are mastering being able to say the sentence we want to write, using finger spaces between each word and reading back what we have written.

In Maths, the children will be reading and writing numbers. They will be recognising 1 more and 1 less than a given number, counting on from a number and comparing numbers.

In history, the children will be learning about significant people and events to do with space. In Art, we will be exploring the colour wheel and learning about colour mixing. We will use our paint skills to create space art inspired by Joe Van Wetering in the coming weeks.


In Science, we will be exploring materials and their properties and describing what materials different objects are made from.

Phonics

To begin the year, the children are revisiting the sounds they have not yet mastered. All phonics sounds are in the centre of the reading record for you to practise with your child at home.

Spelling

There is a list of High Frequency Words and Common Exception Words in the centre of the Reading Record for your child to practise at home. Your child needs to be able to spell these words by the end of the year.



What's happening in Year 2...

Welcome back everyone! We are very excited to be sharing the start of another learning journey with our brand new Year Two's. We have a fantastic year ahead of us.

We will begin by getting to know our class owls in detail. Looking at what their key features are, how they live and the food chain that they are part of. To help inspire us, we will be using the books, 'Owl Babies' and 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark'. We will be learning all about nouns and adjectives and creating owl information posters.

We will then be moving on to learning all about 'Master Makers'.

In Maths, we will be learning about place value, counting objects to one hundred by counting in groups of tens and ordering objects and numbers.

In Science and DT, we will be exploring and learning all about materials and their properties; investigating their strength and flexibility and investigating the ways that they can be joined together.

In History, we will be discovering who Isambard Kingdom Brunel was and why he is significant.

Towards the end of the month we will be out and about in our locality on a sculpture walk. We will be learning all about the different sculptures that we see, discussing the materials they are made from and how we know and creating maps to inform others as to how to find them.
